A LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Yerba Buena Gardens has had a great fiscal year ending June 2024, notwithstanding the major shifts in societal norms after the pandemic. Visitors to our Gardens, on the lands of the Ramaytush Ohlone, are having more of a meaningful interaction with a higher level of aesthetics, cleanliness, accessibility, and signage to make all feel welcome.

Happy to announce that we went live with our new website in early August 2024, along with the roll out of the Memorial Tree and Bench Program to further engage and build community. We are also now offering Memberships to the Conservancy to share the story of the Gardens, and open doors to greater participation in self-directed and directed programs that take place on our campus year-round. Starting in September 2024, we will offer, twice a month, dedicated Walks to educate and inform on the goals of the Conservancy, the caretaker, on the City of San Francisco's behalf, of the two blocks from Mission Street to Folsom Street and surrounded by 3rd and 4th Streets.

All the above shared new programs and the expansion of already staged programs like the Easter Egg Hunt, Earth Day Festival, Halloween Hoopla, and Pistahan will enhance your experience on our campus. Being also the site of one of the largest Martin Luther King Jr. Memorials, we see many from around the world who come to pay

their respects while pausing to reflect on history as depicted on the tablets below the waterfall. The Memorial recently had a major facelift, inside and out, to offer an uplifting experience.

The next year 2025 also brings to our campus the art carvings from Oaxaca, Mexico to be displayed for two months along with programs that speak to the art form along with crafts, food, and films from Mexico. Our free concerts as a part of the Festival that runs from April through October have always been a crowd puller, and they continue to evolve with genres of music and dance not typically seen in the Bay Area on offer.

The assets on site are thirty years old and as we enter the phase of major repair and replacement, we are looking to our community, partners, stakeholders, and donors to share the story of the Gardens so that we may realize our fundraising campaign goals and strengthen our financial status, in our quest to safeguard the site for the next generations to partake of.

Looking forward to seeing you on our campus as you relax, reflect, remember, and rejuvenate yourself in the heart of downtown San Francisco at Yerba Buena Gardens—the soul of the city, offering the city's first rooftop garden.






NEW YERBA BUENA GARDENS MAP
